CREATE Advisory Board

The three members of the CREATE advisory board convened for the first time at the last Assembly of Partners meeting in Paris, in June. We will present them, one by one, in the next editions of our newsletters; for the first portrait let's meet with Helmut Holzapfel:



Helmut Holzapfel is a civil engineer, transportation scientist and urban planner. From 1985 until 1993 he was a government official at the Transport Ministry of North Rhine-Westphalia. Between 1995 and 1998 Holzapfel was the highest transport official in the German state of Saxony-Anhalt. Since 1993, he has been a professor at the faculty of Architecture, Urban and Landscape Planning at the <u>University of Kassel</u>. From 2005 until 2008 he was dean of the faculty. Since 2009 he has led the research project 'Sintropher' in close collaboration with Sir Peter Hall. He is also co-editor of the transport planning journal 'World Transport Policy and Practice'.

Since 2015 Holzapfel is head of the Centre for Mobility Culture in Kassel, Germany, also in 2015 his recent book "Urbanism and Transport" appeared.

Preparation of the mentoring visits

CREATE peer-learning activities are going on! After the successful series of workshadow visits last spring, we are now heading to the second step of the exchange: the mentoring visits.



Preparation of the mentoring visits will start with Stage 1 cities – Adana, Amman, Bucharest, Tallinn and Skopjepreparing their "*Mentee learning needs*" document by 6th September.

With the support of EUROCITIES secretariat, the Stage 3 cities – Berlin, Copenhagen, London, Paris and Viennawill develop a mentoring strategy which will guide the pair thorough the project to reach the best possible results in terms of exchange of practice and of knowledge.
